




In numerous instances, Default Defendants have misrepresented, directly or indirectly, in connection with the advertising, sale, and offering for sale of computer hardware and consumer electronics, that consumers who offered the highest bids and sent defendants the agreed-on payment for the merchandise pursuant to those bids would receive the promised merchandise. The Default Defendants are therefore jointly and severally liable for violating Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a).






