II. THE PROPOSED ACQUISITION

4. Pursuant to anAgreement and Plan of Mergerdated September 20, 2017 ("Agreement"), CRH proposes to acquir@00 percent of the existing voting securities of Ash Grove in a transaction valuedaptproximately \$.5 billion (the "Acquisition"). The Acquisition is subject to Section 7 of the Clayton Act, as amended, 15 U.S.C. § 18.

III. THE RELEVANT MARKETS

15. Opening a new quarry to mine and process crushed limestone in Kansas City typically costs \$30 4 million and takes about five years to accomplish. Additionally, Johnson County has not approved **a**ew quarry site in more than twe**rfty**e years due to public opposition. Given the difficulties of entry in these three relevant markets, it is unlikely that any new entry could be accomplished in a timely manner to defeat a likely price increase caused by the proposed acquisition.

VI. EFFECTS OF THE ACQUISITION

16. The effects of the Acquisition, if consummated, may be to substantially lessen competitionand to tend to create a monopoly in the relevant main evidential of Section 7 of the Clayton Act, as amended, 15 U.S.C1& and Section 5 of the FTC Act, as amended, 15 U.S.C. §45, by eliminating actual, direct, and substantial competition between Respondent CRH and Ash Grovend reducing the number of significant competitors in each relevant market
