This is to advise you that in October 2021, FTC staff reviewed your websites at https://austincompoundingpharmacy.com/, https://capitolchemist.com/, and https://letsasktom.com/. We have also reviewed your social media websites at

Taking Ivermectin once a week will decrease your risk of infection and reduce the severity if you do contract COVID-19.

The order form includes items available by prescription only (e.g., Ivermectin, Hydroxychloroquine, and Azithromycin) and "CORONA SIX PACK SUGGESTIONS" that are available without a prescription (e.g., Flew-Away, Vitamin D3, Zinc, Vitamin C, Melatonin, Viracide, and NU Hist. The order form also includes a "PREVENTION PROTOCOL" and an "EARLY OUTPATIENT PROTOCOL" for COVID-19 from the Front Line COVID-19 Critical Care Alliance.]

"Is there a way to reduce the severity of viral infections? A recent study conducted by researchers from Singapore and Duke Medical School evaluated the effect of daily doses of oral vitamin D3 1000 IU, magnesium 150mg, and vitamin B12 500mcg on COVID progression to severe outcome in older patients. This combination (DMB) was chosen because the relatively safe nutrients help to reduce the inflammatory response to viral infections. The study compared all consecutive hospitalized COVID-19 patients aged 50 and above in a tertiary academic hospital who received DMB upon admission if they did not require oxygen therapy, to a control group of patients who did not take DMB. Significantly fewer DMB patients required oxygen therapy or admission to the intensive care unit (17.6% of patients who took DMB vs 61.5% who did not)." These ultra-high doses of vitamin C are proposed to fight the massive immune response and subsequent respiratory failure seen in coronavirus infection by suppressing the over-reactive inflammatory response in the lungs and slowing down the virus' ability to reproduce and spread. High dose vitamin C can be delivered intravenously which makes it easier for the body to absorb and use. But oral vitamin C can also be helpful. A special form of over-the-counter liposomal Vitamin C can be taken at frequent intervals. Ask our pharmacist for more information." It is unlawful under the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 41 et seq., to advertise that a product or service can prevent, treat, or cure human disease unless you possess competent and reliable scientific evidence, including substantiating that the claims are true at the time they are made. For COVID-19, no such study is currently known to exist for the products identified above. Thus, any coronavirus-related prevention or treatment claims regarding such products are not supported by competent and reliable scientific evidence.

You are also advised to review all other claims for your products and immediately cease and desist from making claims that are not supported by competent and reliable scientific evidence. You must immediately cease and desist making all such claims.

Violations of the FTC Act may result in legal action seeking a Federal District Court injunction. In addition, pursuant to the COVID-19 Consumer Protection Act, Section 1401, Division FF, of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021, P.L. 116-260, marketers who make deceptive claims about the treatment, cure, prevention, or mitigation of COVID-19 are subject to a civil penalty of up to \$43,792 per violation and may be required to pay refunds to consumers or provide other relief pursuant to Section 19(b) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 57b(b).
