This is to advise you that FTCast has reviewed your website at <u>https://www.drchristianson.comon</u> May 5, 2020. We have determent that you are unlawfully advertising that certain produsc that can be purchased your website treat or prevent Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

Some examples of Coronavirus treatmemprevention claims on your website include:

- x In marketing materials titled "Special ent: Coronavirus and What You Need to Know," in a section titled "Natural Solutions," you state, Pfior coronavirus outbreaks, like MERS and SARS, can gives one insight into some of the more natural treatments that we may consipler suing." You then list the following:
 - "EchinaceaEchinacea is known as both antiviral and preventive. In addition, it has been shown as effect against the avian virus in animal studiesIn the past, echinacea was thought to be a concern for autoimmune disease. That said, this concers become less and less relevant. We know that it works through immune modulationnel not simple immune stimulation. It is alsoknown to be safe aneffective for long-term use."
 - "Astragalus In living animal and test-tube studies, this has been shown to kill other coronaviruses. This study, inticalar, suggested that it has the potential to diminish diseasprogression in chickens and could be used to the control of coronaviruses."

- o "Andrographis This compound has been shown to make influenza viruses less able to cause pulmonary damagenenbody. It also has antiviral and immunoregulatory properties."
- o "Arabinogalactan The effects of glycans are both simple and complex and can play a profound role in metabolic, structural, and physical roles in biological systems. In knowing this can learn more about their evolutionary role and what they carl us about biological complexity."

It is unlawful under the TC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 4et seq. to advertise that a product can prevent, treat, or cuheman disease unless you possess competent and reliable scientific evidence, includingyhen appropriate, well-confled human clinical studies, substantiating that the claimase true at the time they a made. For COVID-19, no such study is currently known to exist for the protact entified above. Thus, any Coronavirusrelated prevention or treatment claimg and ing such products are not supported by competent and reliable scientific evidence winst immediately cease making all such claims.

You are also advised tovie w all other claims for your products and immediately cease making claims that are not supported by etempand reliable scientific evidence.
